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## Executive Summary

## Enrollment - Fall 2023

- Total census enrollment is 6,405 , a decrease of 40 students ( $0.6 \%$ ) from the previous fall semester.
- Total undergraduate enrollment is 5,507 . This is an increase of 43 students ( $0.8 \%$ ) from fall 2022. Full-time undergraduate enrollment is 4,909 an increase of 48 students (1.0\%).
- Total degrees granted for 2022-23 is 1,822 ; a decrease of 11.1 percent from last year. There were 1,210 Bachelor's degrees and 612 Masters and Advanced Certificates granted.
- Total graduate enrollment is 898 , a decrease of 83 students ( $8.5 \%$ ) from fall 2022.
- Total enrollment in the residence halls is 1,906 . This is an increase of 223 students ( $13.3 \%$ ) from fall 2022. Since fall 2019 , residence hall occupancy has decreased by 14.5 percent.


## Demographics - Fall 2023

- Ninety-five (95.2) percent of our total enrollment is from New York State. Fifty-five (54.6) percent is from Erie County; seven (6.9) percent is from Niagara County; twenty-one (21.4) percent is from the Metro NYC area, and thirteen (12.5) percent is from other New York State Counties.
- Fifty-four (53.9) percent of the college's undergraduate enrollments are minority students. Forty-seven (47.1) percent of total undergraduates are classified as underrepresented minorities. Graduate minority student enrollment is 237 (26.4\%). Graduate underrepresented minority student enrollment remained steady at twenty-two (21.9) percent from twenty-one (21.4) percent the previous fall.
- Women represent fifty-nine (59.3) percent of the total student population. Fifty-seven (56.8) percent of our undergraduates and seventy-four (74.3) percent of graduate student population are women. This is an increase of 0.4 percentage points for our graduate student population from the previous fall.


## New Students - Fall 2023

- New freshman enrollment is 1,486 . This is an increase of 210 students ( $16.5 \%$ ) from fall 2022.
- New transfer enrollment is 559, an increase of 124 students (28.5\%) from fall 2022.
- New graduate enrollment is 363, an increase of 57 students (18.6\%) from fall 2022.


## Academic Profile, First-time Full-time - Fall 2023

- The mean high school average for all first-time, full-time students remained steady at 84.0 from last fall. The mean SAT Composite (verbal and math) score for all first-time, full-time students increased to 1081 from 1062. Since Fall 2021, SUNY has directed campuses to be test-optional due to the COVID-19 pandemic. For fall 2023, only $12 \%$ of the First-time, Fulltime matriculated students submitted standardized test scores. This resulted in a larger than expected increase in SAT Composite scores since Fall 2021.
- The mean high school average for honors students is 95.4. The mean SAT score for honors students increased 52 points to 1212 .
- The mean high school average for general freshmen remained steady at 84.5 from the previous fall. The mean SAT Composite score increased 11 points to 1084.
- The mean high school average for EOP students decreased slightly to 79.0 from 79.6 last fall. The mean SAT score increased 157 points to 1048.


## FTE - Fall 2023

- Total FTE is estimated at 5,576. This is an increase of 8 FTE ( $0.1 \%$ ) from fall 2022.
- Total undergraduate FTE is estimated at 5,049. This is an increase of 70 FTE (1.4\%) from fall 2022.
- Total graduate FTE is estimated 527 , down 62 FTE (10.5\%) from the previous fall.


## School of Arts and Sciences - Fall 2023

- Total enrollment is 2,580, an increase of 57 students ( $2.3 \%$ ) from fall 2022. The school enrollment represents forty (40.3) percent of the total college enrollment and forty-two (42.3) percent of the undergraduate population.


## School of Education - Fall 2023

- Total enrollment is 995 a decrease of 41 students (3.5\%) from fall 2022. It represents sixteen (15.5) percent of the total college enrollment and ten (10.1) percent of the undergraduate population. The School of Education's graduate enrollment of 435 represents forty-eight (48.4) percent of the graduate population and is the largest of the four graduate schools.


## School of the Professions - Fall 2023

- Total enrollment is 2,268, a decrease of 120 students (5.0\%) from fall 2022. The school represents thirty-five (35.4) percent of the college's total enrollment and thirty-eight (37.9) percent of the total undergraduate enrollment. The school represents twenty (19.8) percent of the graduate enrollment.


## First-Time, full-time, One-Year Retention Rate at Buffalo State (fall 2022 Cohort)

- The first-time, full-time retention rate is fifty-five (54.7) percent, five (5.4) percentage points higher than last fall. First-year retention rate increased to fifty-seven (57.2) percent from fifty-three (52.6) for the School of Arts \& Sciences. First-year retention increased for School of Education and School of the Professions from the previous fall. The School of Education first-year retention was the highest among the three schools at $67.1 \%$ and the School of the Professions was the lowest at $52.0 \%$.
- First-year retention rate for residential students increased from forty-five (44.5) percent to fifty-one (50.8) percent. First-year retention rate for commuter students increased from fiftyeight (58.3) percent to sixty-two (61.5) percent.
- First-year retention rate for Muriel A. Howard Honors program (MAH) students decreased from seventy-nine (79.0) percent to seventy-eight (77.6) percent when compared to the fall 2021 cohort. Muriel A. Howard Honors program (MAH) has the highest retention rate among all cohorts for fall 2022.
- First-year retention rate for Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) students increased to sixty (59.8) percent from forty (39.7) percent when compared to the fall 2021 cohort.
- First-year retention rate for female students (59.0\%) is higher than the first-year rate for male students ( $49.8 \%$ ). Male student first-year rate increased by 3.2 percentage points from fall 2022. Since fall 2018, our female retention rate has decreased 2.9 percentage points from 61.9\%.
- First-year retention rate for SAY YES students decreased to fifty (50.0) percent from fiftythree (53.1) percent, a decrease of three (3.1) percentage points.

## UNDERGRADUATE FRESHMAN ADMISSIONS

FALL 2021 THRU FALL 2023


Total freshman applications increased (29.4\%) from 12,351 to 15,982.
Fifty-nine (58.8) percent of freshman applications were completed from Metro NYC region, down from 62.3\%, a decrease of 3.5 percentage points from fall 2022.


The mean high school average for all freshmen remained steady at 84.0 from fall 2022.
The mean high school average for regular admit w/o spec. status also remained steady at 84.5 from fall 2022.
The mean SAT score for regular admit increased to 1081 from 1062. Fall freshman class is 1,486 , an increase of $16.5 \%$ from fall 2022 .

## Glossary

## Census

The date the college freeze the enrollment file for reporting purpose. This is usually the third of week of the semester. For Fall 2021, the file froze on the sixth week of the semester due to SUNY's vaccine non-compliance mandate.

## Contract Students

This is an International Graduate Programs for Educators that provides students worldwide with the opportunity to engage in the school's multidisciplinary degree program. This is a self-support program. The contracted tuition revenues do not count toward state support or SUNY approved planned enrollment and revenues.

## Continuing Students

Undergraduate - an undergraduate student registered in the current term who was enrolled at Buffalo State during the previous term. In the case of the Fall term, "previous term" shall mean either the previous Summer or Spring term; e.g., those undergraduate students in the Fall 2020 who were enrolled at Buffalo State during Summer 2020 or Spring 2020 are continuing students.

Graduate - a graduate student registered in the current term who was enrolled at Buffalo State as a Graduate Student during the previous term. In the case of the Fall term, "previous term" shall mean either the previous Summer or Spring term; e.g., those graduate students in the Fall 2020 who were enrolled at Buffalo State during Summer 2020 or Spring 2020 are continuing students.

## First-time Retention rate

The retention rate is based on first-time, full-time, matriculated students (A student who has not been previously enrolled at any college or university and who is enrolled for the first time at Buffalo State for the cohort term) who were enrolled for the fall 2016 term and are currently enrolled for fall 2020 term with either a fulltime or part-time status. Students who are on any leave of absence are counted in the retention rate.

Full-time Equivalent Workload is a unit of measure usually derived from student credit hours. One FTE workload is equivalent to 15 student credit hours in undergraduate courses, or 12 student credit hours in graduate courses. Certificate of Advance Study are calculated as follows: One FTE for full-time Advance Graduate Students, 0.75 FTE for part-time Advance Graduate Students.

## Matriculated

A student enrolled at the Buffalo State and is considered by the institution to be currently pursuing a specific type of degree (such as bachelors, masters, etc...) and who has or has not yet chosen a major field of study.

## Non-Matriculated

A student enrolled at Buffalo State to take certain credit courses and is not considered by the institution to be currently pursuing a specific type of degree (such as bachelors, masters, etc...).

## New Students

## Freshman

A student who has not been previously enrolled at any college or university and who is enrolled for the first time at Buffalo State this term. A student whose previous post-secondary education was only at a non-collegiate institution such as a business school or technical institute is a first-time student, unless Buffalo State expects to give college credit for such activities in which case the student is a transfer student.

## Transfer

An undergraduate student who is enrolled at your institution for the first time in the current term, but who has attended other colleges or universities prior to the current term. The actual number of credit hours he/she is allowed to transfer is not relevant to the distinction between a transfer and a first-time student, even if no credits were ultimately transferable.

## Graduate

A graduate student, whose first enrollment as a graduate student at your institution, occurs during the current term.

## Returning Students

Undergraduate - an undergraduate student registered in the current term and who has been enrolled at Buffalo State but was not enrolled in the previous term. In the case of the fall term, "previous term" shall include either the previous summer or spring term; e.g., an undergraduate student in the fall 2020 is a returning student if he/she was previously enrolled at Buffalo State but in neither the spring 2020 nor summer 2020 terms.

Graduate - a graduate student registered in the current term and who has been enrolled at Buffalo State as a GRADUATE student but was not enrolled as a GRADUATE student in the previous term. In the case of the fall term, "previous term" shall include either the previous summer or Spring term; e.g., a graduate student in the Fall 2020 is a returning student, if he/she was previously enrolled as a GRADUATE student at Buffalo State but in neither the Spring 2020 nor Summer 2020 terms.

## Selectivity Groups

Very Selective is comparable to SUNY's Memorandum of Understandings of Group 1 and Group 2.
Selective is comparable to SUNY's Memorandum of Understandings of Group 3.
Less Selective is comparable to SUNY's Memorandum of Understandings of Group 4 and Group 5.
Selectivity groups do not include EOP and COMPASS

Success and Progress rate is the cumulative persistence or graduate rate of an initial cohort at the initial institution and at other institutions of Higher Education.

Underrepresented Minority Students include African American, Hispanic, and NativeAmerican, Multiracial or Two or more Races.
