Executive Summary

Enrollment – Fall 2020

- Total census enrollment is 8,339. This is a decrease of 319 students (3.7%) from the previous fall semester.
- Total undergraduate enrollment is 7,309. This is a decrease of 338 students (4.4%) from fall 2019. Full-time undergraduate enrollment is 6,582, a decrease of 334 students (4.8%).
- Total degrees granted for 2019-20 is 2,122; this is a decrease of 7.3 percent from last year. There were 1,568 Bachelor's degrees and 554 Masters and Advanced Certificates granted.
- Total graduate enrollment is 1,030. This is an increase of 19 students (1.9%) from fall 2019.
- Total enrollment in the residence halls is 1,654. This is a decrease of 574 students (25.8%) from fall 2019. Since fall 2016, residence hall occupancy has decreased by 39.9 percent.

Demographics – Fall 2020

- Ninety-seven (96.9) percent of our total enrollment is from New York State. Fifty-three (52.8) percent is from Erie County; seven (7.2) percent is from Niagara County; twenty-eight (27.6) percent is from the Metro NYC area, and twelve (12.4) percent is from other New York State Counties.
- Fifty-five (55.1) percent of the college's undergraduate enrollments are minority students. Fifty (50.1) percent of the total undergraduate are classified as underrepresented minorities. Graduate minority student enrollment is 246 (23.9%). Graduate underrepresented minority student enrollment stayed consisted at twenty-two (21.6) percent.
- Women represent sixty (59.5) percent of the total student population. Fifty-eight (57.6) percent of our undergraduates and seventy-three (72.5) percent of graduate student population are women. This is an increase of 0.1% for our graduate student population from previous fall.

New Students - Fall 2020

- New freshman enrollment is 1,639. This is a decrease of 49 students (2.9%) from fall 2019.
- New transfer enrollment is 598, a decrease of 172 students (22.3%) from fall 2019.
- New graduate enrollment is 297. This is an increase of 4 students (1.3%) from fall 2019.

Academic Profile, First-time Full-time – Fall 2020

- The mean high school average for all first-time, full-time students decreased to 83.6 from 84.0 last fall. The mean SAT Composite (verbal and math) score for all first-time, full-time students decreased to 968 from 991.
- The mean high school average for honors students is 94.3. The mean SAT score for honors students decreased 29 points to 1180.
- The mean high school average for general freshmen decreased to 84.1 from 85.0 the previous fall. The mean SAT Composite score decreased 35 points to 974.
- The mean high school average for EOP students stayed consistent at 80.9. The mean SAT score decreased 5 points to 923.

FTE - Fall 2020

- Total FTE is estimated at 7,464. This is a decrease of 250 FTE (3.2%) from fall 2019.
- Total undergraduate FTE is estimated at 6,808. This is a decrease of 287 FTE (4.0%) from fall 2019.
- Total graduate FTE is estimated 656, up 37 FTE (5.6%) from previous fall.

School of Arts and Humanities - Fall 2020

• Total enrollment is 1,315, a decrease of 103 students (7.3%) from fall 2019. The school enrollment represents sixteen (15.8) percent of the total college enrollment and seventeen (16.6) percent of the undergraduate population.

School of Education – Fall 2020

• Total enrollment is 1,178 an increase of 59 students (5.0%) from fall 2019. It represents fourteen (14.1) percent of the total college enrollment and ten (9.5) percent of the undergraduate population. The School of Education's graduate enrollment of 484 represents forty-seven (47.0) percent of the graduate population and is the largest of the four graduate schools.

School of Natural and Social Sciences - Fall 2020

• Total enrollment is 2,262, a decrease of 36 students (1.6%) from fall 2019. The school represents twenty-seven (27.1) percent of the total college enrollment and twenty-eight (28.3) percent of the total undergraduate population.

School of the Professions - Fall 2020

• Total enrollment is 2,932, a decrease of 108 students (3.6%) from fall 2019. The school is the largest among the four schools in total enrollment and represents thirty-five (35.2) percent of the college's total enrollment. It is also the largest of the four schools in undergraduate enrollment and represents thirty-seven (37.4) percent of the total undergraduate enrollment. The school represents nineteen (19.4) percent of the graduate enrollment.

First-Time, full-time, One-Year Retention Rate at Buffalo State (fall 2019 Cohort)

- The first-time, full-time retention rate is sixty-five (64.5) percent, six (6.3) percentage points higher than last fall. First-year retention rate increased for all four schools. The School of Education first-year retention was the highest among the four schools at 72.0% and the School of Natural & Social Sciences was the lowest at 61.6%.
- First-year retention rate for residential students increased from fifty-five (55.0) percent to 61 (61.4) percent. First-year retention rate for commuter students increased from sixty-three (63.0) percent to seventy (69.6) percent.
- First-year retention rate for Muriel A. Howard Honors program (MAH) students increased from eighty-six (85.3) to eighty-five (85.4) percent when compared to fall 2018 cohort. Muriel A. Howard Honors program (MAH) has the highest retention rate among all cohorts for fall 2018.
- First-year retention rate for Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) students increased to sixty-nine (69.3) percent from sixty-two (62.4) percent when compared to fall 2018 cohort.
- First-year retention rate for female students (68.6%) is higher than the first-year rate for male students (58.7%). Male student first-year rate decreased by about 7 percentage points. Since fall 2015, our female retention rate has decreased nearly 2 percentage points from 70.3%.
- First-year retention rate for SAY YES students increased to sixty-four (63.8) percent, an increase of 17 percentage points.


UNDERGRADUATE FRESHMAN ADMISSIONS FALL 2018 THRU FALL 2020

Total freshman applications decreased (9.1%) from 14,653 to 13,321.

Sixty-six (65.7) percent of freshman applications were completed from Metro NYC region, down from 66.1%, a decrease of 1.1 percentage points from fall 2018.




ACCEPTS

The mean high school average for regular admit w/o spec. status decreased to 84.1 from 85.0 in fall 2019.

The mean SAT score for regular admit decreased to 974 from 1009. Fall freshman class is 1,639, a decrease of 2.9% from fall 2019.




UNDERGRADUATE TRANSFER ADMISSIONS

APPLICATIONS










GRADUATE ADMISSIONS FALL 2018 THRU FALL 2020



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






Trends in Degrees Granted



Glossary

Census

The date the college freeze the enrollment file for reporting purpose. This is usually the third of week of the semester

Contract Students

This is an International Graduate Programs for Educators that provides students worldwide with the opportunity to engage in the school's multidisciplinary degree program. This is a self-support program. The contracted tuition revenues do not count toward state support or SUNY approved planned enrollment and revenues.

Continuing Students

Undergraduate – an undergraduate student registered in the current term who was enrolled at Buffalo State during the previous term. In the case of the Fall term, "previous term" shall mean either the previous Summer or Spring term; e.g., those undergraduate students in the Fall 2020 who were enrolled at Buffalo State during Summer 2020 or Spring 2020 are continuing students.

Graduate – a graduate student registered in the current term who was enrolled at Buffalo State as a Graduate Student during the previous term. In the case of the Fall term, "previous term" shall mean either the previous Summer or Spring term; e.g., those graduate students in the Fall 2020 who were enrolled at Buffalo State during Summer 2020 or Spring 2020 are continuing students.

First-time Retention rate

The retention rate is based on first-time, full-time, matriculated students (A student who has not been previously enrolled at any college or university and who is enrolled for the first time at Buffalo State for the cohort term) who were enrolled for the fall 2016 term and are currently enrolled for fall 2020 term with either a full-time or part-time status. Students who are on any leave of absence are counted in the retention rate.

FTE

Full-time Equivalent Workload is a unit of measure usually derived from student credit hours. One FTE workload is equivalent to 15 student credit hours in undergraduate courses, or 12 student credit hours in graduate courses. Certificate of Advance Study are calculated as follows: One FTE for full-time Advance Graduate Students, 0.75 FTE for part-time Advance Graduate Students.

Matriculated

A student enrolled at the Buffalo State and is considered by the institution to be currently pursuing a specific type of degree (such as bachelors, masters, etc...) and who has <u>or</u> has not yet chosen a major field of study.

Metro NYC

Bronx County, Kings County, Nassau County, New York County, Queens County, Rockland County, Suffolk County, Westchester County

Non-Matriculated

A student enrolled at Buffalo State to take certain credit courses and is not considered by the institution to be currently pursuing a specific type of degree (such as bachelors, masters, etc...).

New Students

Freshman

A student who has not been previously enrolled at any college or university and who is enrolled for the first time at Buffalo State this term. A student whose previous post-secondary education was only at a non-collegiate institution such as a business school or technical institute is a first-time student, unless Buffalo State expects to give college credit for such activities in which case the student is a transfer student.

Transfer

An undergraduate student who is enrolled at your institution for the first time in the current term, but who has attended other colleges or universities prior to the current term. The actual number of credit hours he/she is allowed to transfer is not relevant to the distinction between a transfer and a first-time student, even if no credits were ultimately transferable.

Graduate

A graduate student, whose first enrollment as a graduate student at your institution, occurs during the current term.

Returning Students

Undergraduate – an undergraduate student registered in the current term and who has been enrolled at Buffalo State but was <u>not</u> enrolled in the previous term. In the case of the fall term, "previous term" shall include either the previous summer or spring term; e.g., an undergraduate student in the fall 2020 is a returning student if he/she was previously enrolled at Buffalo State but in neither the spring 2020 nor summer 2020 terms.

Graduate – a graduate student registered in the current term and who has been enrolled at Buffalo State as a GRADUATE student but was <u>not</u> enrolled as a GRADUATE student in the previous term. In the case of the fall term, "previous term" shall include either the previous summer or Spring term; e.g., a graduate student in the Fall 2020 is a returning student, if he/she was previously enrolled as a GRADUATE student at Buffalo State but in neither the Spring 2020 nor Summer 2020 terms.

Selectivity Groups

Very Selective is comparable to SUNY's Memorandum of Understandings of Group 1 and Group 2.

Selective is comparable to SUNY's Memorandum of Understandings of Group 3. **Less Selective** is comparable to SUNY's Memorandum of Understandings of Group 4 and Group 5.

Selectivity groups do not include EOP and COMPASS

Success and Progress rate is the cumulative persistence or graduate rate of an initial cohort at the initial institution and at other institutions of Higher Education.

Underrepresented Minority Students include African-American, Hispanic, and Native-American, Multiracial or Two or more Races.
